

United States Magistrate Judge Robert B. Jones, Jr.

Robert B. Jones, Jr. was appointed as a part-time Magistrate Judge of the U.S. District Court for the Eastern District of North Carolina in October 2007. He was appointed as a full-time Magistrate Judge in June 2013. He practiced civil litigation in Raleigh and Wilmington prior to his appointment. His previous work included service as a law clerk to Judge Boyce F. Martin, Jr., of the U.S. Court of Appeals for the Sixth Circuit in Louisville, Kentucky. After receiving his undergraduate degree from Davidson College, he obtained his law degree from Campbell University School of Law. Judge Jones serves as chairperson of the Local Admiralty Rules Committee. He is a member of the North Carolina Bar Association and the New Hanover County Bar Association. Judge Jones is a former member of the Law-Related Education (LRE) Advisory Committee to the North Carolina Bar Association, during which time he was a contributing editor of *The North Carolina Constitution Explained*, a classroom guide for teachers on the state constitution. Judge Jones maintains chambers in Wilmington.
